## Consent to data transfer outside the European Union (EU) or the European Economic Area (EEA)

Please be aware that the GIBACHT programme involves transfer of your personal data to countries outside the EU or EEA which may not have the same level of data protection as the EU. For legal reasons, we need your consent to this international data transfer. Your consent to this transfer is and will remain voluntary and you are under no obligation to consent to this transfer. However, if you do not consent, unfortunately you will not be able to participate in the GIBACHT programme, as such international data transfer is absolutely necessary in order to conduct the GIBACHT programme.

The following transfer of personal data outside the EU or EEA occurs as part of the GIBACHT program:

The BNITM will share the application form, including your documents, within the GIBACHT consortium for applicant selection. During this process, personal data will be transmitted to the African Field Epidemiology Network ("AFENET") in Uganda. In addition, international data transfer occurs when applicants come from countries outside the EU or the EEA and certain personal data are transferred (back) to these applicants. Finally, for workshops conducted via web meetings, processing of personal data outside the EU or EEA may occur. This is because the providers of the web meeting tools and their subcontractors are usually located outside the EU or EEA and typically in the U.S.

In case of a transfer of personal data outside the EU or EEA and there is no adequacy decision or appropriate safeguards in place, it is possible and there is a risk that authorities in the respective country (such as intelligence agencies) may gain access to the transmitted data for the purpose of collecting and analysing it, and that the enforceability of your data subject rights cannot be guaranteed.
